

Update on Natural Bridges Campus Construction Project

Though our new campus is not yet ready for us to move in, we've been making steady progress on the long list of construction items that will make Natural Bridges an excellent facility for our program. We continue to work closely with Santa Cruz City Schools, and are grateful for their collaboration even as they juggle projects on 14 sites across the city while also opening their schools for the new school year.

Here's what's happened this summer:

- The re-roofing project has been completed.
- The solar tube installation project has been completed, with 27 solar tubes installed and the infrastructure for 70 more tubes put in place.
- The front parking lot has been entirely resurfaced, and two ADA-compliant parking spaces have been added in front of the building.
- A new back-flow prevention device has been installed, which will protect the potable water and water pressure at the site.
- A number of internal and external windows have been replaced.
- Bathroom fixtures and partitions have been replaced.
- Demolition of interior walls and fixtures is underway, including relocating classroom whiteboards to take advantage of the improved lighting configuration.
- The interior walls and floors of the Life Lab, Spanish and Art portables have been repaired and/or replaced.
- The floor of the gym and the interior bleachers have been removed, in preparation for upgrade and replacement.
- Our amazing Life Lab teacher, Caprice Potter, and the admin continue to work with SSA, our landscape architects, on the Life Lab project
- An interior design plan has been finalized, and furniture ordered.
- The internal and external paint palette has been selected.
- The new Elementary play structure has been ordered

We will continue to keep you informed about the construction progress, and updated about plans for the move once that timeline is determined.
